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Prerequisites: Students should be familiar with basic international trade theory.

Course Objectives: International trade has rapidly embraced digitalization, yet many aspects of digital trade entail fundamentally open questions. This seminar seeks to understand priority policy issues. Three topics are pertinent in particular. First, how can digital trade be measured and reflected in official statistics (e.g., GDP)? Second, what are the legal problems involved, for example, with respect to different data protection legislation? Third, how can multilateral economic policy approaches be designed and complement domestic policies? We review first contributions to these topics.
